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
Adventure with Purpose


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About South Africa

South Africa is a unique nation with a diverse culture. It's home to some of the most beautiful landscapes around the world. Visitors to the Southern tip of Africa will find famous beaches as well as popular national parks and historical sites. The country of South Africa has the ability to host Christian students in a secure environment while providing exposure to a rich diversity of cultures, languages, economic classes, businesses and missions models. Furthermore, South Africa is a very affordable option for interning abroad as local transportation, safe accommodation, food and world class training facilities come at very affordable prices.

Key Components for all Interns

- Participate in a orientation week with local South African leaders and entrepreneurs. Topics will include:
 - Kingdom Business mindedness
 - The Holy Spirit in your entrepreneurial activities
 - Ways of Wisdom
 - Understanding cross cultural awareness and diverse immersion
 - Christian discipleship
 - Lessons from the African wildlife arena
 - Reaching the unreached people groups for Christ by utilizing entrepreneurship.
 - Talks, walks & more
- Cultural Immersion
- Gain knowledge of cultural and historical aspects of the country through visiting important sites in South Africa such as the Nelson Mandela square in Sandton, The Voortrekker monument in Pretoria, places of interest around Johannesburg, economic hubs, businesses and Universities and talking to leaders of organizations
- Interact with local peers, students, and professionals in the George (Garden Route) area
- Attend a thriving South African church of your choice. (Refer to "Church Life" below for more information.)
- Go on weekend adventures with your friends throughout the beautiful landscapes of South Africa
- Have access to mentors
- Get hands-on experience in your chosen vocation
- Go on a Safari, volunteer with Lions, Elephant feeding excursion, learn about South African famous wildlife
- Work on outreach programs (most likely children's outreach) and learn valuable skills and people management skills to compliment the entrepreneurial program with some missions minded input
- Take part and serve in the Young Influencers Conference. Young Influencers Conference is an inspiring and equipping conference for young people to learn kingdom business principles and how to apply it to their lives. It seeks to encourage 'young influencers' to make a difference in their context by making His ways known.



Specific to Business Internships

- Exposure to high level business in SA including the stock exchange and Gauteng business district that handles 40% of Africa’s business.
- Exposure to successful social entrepreneurial models in South Africa
- Field work, including
 - Understanding the local market demographics
 - Working in local businesses and receiving exposure to various departments and being involved with projects associated with these businesses
 - Projects could include the development of digital and social media marketing strategies, resource planning, multi-channel sales development, revenue growth strategies as well as operations optimization
 - Presenting the outcome of work projects, demonstrating clear communication skills that offer value to business management regarding efficiency, profitability, marketing, growth and any other measurable improvements they might identify for the business.



Specific to Ministry Internships

- Exposure to ministries operating across diverse cultures, languages and world views
- Exposure to large and small churches and church models
- Field work, including:
 - Working in a local church as a ministerial assistant
 - Working in a local church and receiving exposure to various departments and being involved with projects associated with these churches
 - Working on projects such as digital and social media communication platforms, resource planning, as well as exposure to existing operations
 - Presenting the outcome of work, demonstrating clear communication skills that offer value to church management regarding efficiency, marketing, growth and any other measurable improvements they might identify for the church
 - Working on caring, counselling, outreach and other ministerial aspects





SAFETY & SECURITY

Intern safety is our top priority. South Africa as a whole has a high crime index, however, the majority of the internship experience will be in George South Africa which is one of the top five safest cities in the nation. According to recent surveys, George's crime and safety scale rating is very similar to Tulsa, Oklahoma's. To mitigate naturally occurring risk when traveling in an unknown city, interns will be briefed by locals on standard safety protocol during orientation. Even with George's relatively low crime rate, O4 has developed risk management and safety protocol to implement an even higher degree of safety. O4 practices have been developed over 10+ years of hosting over 400 international visitors to South Africa.

HEALTHCARE

- Medical insurance is required for each Intern. Please refer to your University policies as well as your medical aid provider for coverage to ensure that international medical expenses are covered. South African hosts will need proof of medical insurance before interns arrive in South Africa.
- South Africa is a country with adequate healthcare facilities. While it is not recommended to rely on the public health system exclusively in South Africa, access to excellent private healthcare facilities will be available during the trip.
- All visitors will also have to sign a general liability waiver and must bring original prescriptions for any regular medication. Medicine brand names may be different in South Africa, and in some cases may not be available.
- Upon admittance to the internship program, each intern must provide their host with a list of medical history, allergies, and regularly taken medications.

VACCINATIONS, MALARIA AND COVID 19

- According to our knowledge and experience, no Vaccinations are necessary for South Africa, however it is recommended that you consult the US State Department website to confirm.
- The places of visitation including George is not a Malaria area. Consult with your doctor on whether to take malaria medication. We will also assist with shopping for Mosquito repellent and precautionary arm and ankle bands if needed.

The cost of the program covers the internship experience and training, as well as:

HOUSING

- George - Students will be housed throughout the program at Hiskia Guset Farm in George located approximately 20 minutes outside of George.

- On Excursions students will be hosted in star rated hotels and guesthouses that ascribes to the standards as set out by the South African Tourism Board.

SLEEPING ARRANGEMENTS, CLEANING AND SERVING EXPECTATIONS

- Interns will be sharing rooms and will be expected to keep the rooms clean and tidy at all times
- Interns will be separated into a male area and a female area
- Interns will also be expected to serve at Hiskia Guest Farm and help maintain the cleanliness and hygiene of all public areas
- Interns will in most cases be expected to do their own dishes
- Interns will be expected to do their own laundry
- Clean Bedding will be supplied every 7-10 days by the hosts

FOOD ARRANGEMENTS

This will vary from place to place but mostly at Hiskia Guest Farm will consist of the following:

- Breakfast is continental and self-help and consists of homemade warm grits or oatmeal, eggs, toast, fruit, coffee and tea with the occasional strawberries and pancakes and other treats.
- Lunch will be part of breakfast self-help. Bread and other lunch items will be set out and each person will pack their own lunches.
- Dinner will be at Hiskia Guest Farm and there will be a variety of home cooked meals and cultural delights that will change every night.

Every person will be responsible for assisting in cleaning their dishes and the kitchen / dining areas. Other Practical assistance will also be required.

ACTIVITIES AROUND GEORGE/ EXCURSIONS

George is world renowned as an adventure destination, and there are many opportunities for excursions in the area. Interns will be able to do research ahead of time to plan ahead for weekend excursions. During the orientation we will make a list of interns' proposed activities and assist in the planning to ensure all interns make the most of their time in South Africa. TRANSPORTATION

All transportation to and from the organizations will be provided. As well as transportation to any programs, events, and any scheduled trips organized by O4.

FITNESS AND EXERCISE

The groups interns will be socializing with are very fond of exercise. The city of George is also a runner, walkers, swimmers, tennis, golfers and MTB cyclist paradise as there are many beaches, mountains, woods and parks to explore. Bring the gear you might need for your sport/exercise training. A Gym pass or CrossFit pass can also be arranged. You can also be added to local messaging groups on WhatsApp to learn about local events and opportunities to participate in events over weekends and after hours.

INTERNET & MOBILE

- Most places interns visit and work at will have good internet and wifi availability.
- Interns can decide to get a South African sim card if they feel it is needed to make normal local voice calls
- As a group, all interns will use WhatsApp as communication and all daily communication, arrangements etc, will be made on this Whatsapp group that will be created closer to the time
